

Jobs/Worksites typically fall into three categories:

Independently Employed/ Competitive Employment occurs when an individual applies for and obtains a general job within the community with minimal (if any) accommodations or additional support.

In general the most successful job placements for students with moderate to severe needs is with a friend or family member who can act as an employer, job coach, and advocate. If you have access to such a placement please let your student's classroom teacher know as they can tailor instruction to help your learner be successful in this placement.

Supported Employment is a model of employment that provides people with severe disabilities the appropriate, ongoing support that is necessary for success in a competitive work environment. Most individuals in a supported employment program receive services from a community-based service provider. Generally, community-based service providers offer vocational assessment, locate or develop jobs, and provide job skills training. Most providers have job coaches who work at the job site and help the client learn job tasks, identify job modifications including assistive technology, and work with the employer to solve behavioral or social problems.

Sheltered Workshops offer employment and/or vocational training to adults with disabilities who do not possess the competencies or skills for competitive or supported employment.

Sheltered workshops allow participants to practice in jobs or tasks where the processes are either simple or broken down into simpler steps. Participants gain valuable experience at the workshop, thereby improving their prospects for open employment. Typically these opportunities are provided by a community organization and are geared toward people with disabilities and/or those from disadvantaged backgrounds, such as ethnic minority groups, the long-term unemployed, and those returning to the workforce after a period of rehabilitation. The word 'sheltered' refers to a protective environment where disadvantaged people can undertake paid meaningful employment in a supportive environment.
